CIRCULAR

School Health Programme is envisaged as an **important tool** for the provision of preventive, primitive and curative health services to the population. Its focus is to address holistically the **health** and **nutrition** needs of children in a manner which fulfils the needs of today's lifestyle. As per **MDM guidelines** on School Health Programme, various components are;

- > Screening of general health, assessment of Anaemia/Nutritional status, visual acuity, dental check up, common skin conditions etc.
- > Immunization as per National schedule.
- > Distribution of Vitamin A and Iron Folic Acid tablets.

- > De-worming as per National schedule. Siblings of the students also to be covered.
- Health Promoting Schools where counselling services, Promotion of mental well being, Yoga practices, Physical Education, Health Clubs/Cabinets and First Aid room/corner or clinics are provided.
- > Capacity building of teachers and involved health personnel by Health and Family Welfare Department.

Management structure as followed for the RCH programme can be followed for the implementation of the School Health Program at State, District and Block levels. The National Rural Health Mission (NRHM) convergence mechanism can apply to this programme as well. Children of the schools in the age group **6 to 14** years are being checked up by the Medical staff of the nearby Health Centre at least twice in a year and the Basic medicine kit of common ailments and referral Card for priority services at District/sub-district hospital to be provided. The requisite data on regular health check up has to be reflected in the MPRs and QPRs in the prescribed formats of the GOI. However, from the perusal of the MPRs and QPRs submitted by all the Chief Education Officers, no such data is

being supplied by the districts. MHRD, Government of India, has raised serious concern about the nil coverage of the schools under School Health Program particularly in Kashmir Division.

It is, therefore, enjoined upon all the Chief Education Officers to have close liaison with the Chief Medical Officers of their respective districts to set up a mechanism for the regular medical check-up of the school going children

under School Health Program by providing Vitamin A and Iron Folic Acid tablets, spectacles to visually impaired children under NRHM programme and requisite data be reflected in the MPRs & QPRs in the prescribed formats of the Government of India. School Education Kashmir
